Chair

Sarah expressed her thanks to everyone for attending and their ongoing support, explaining the purpose of the meeting was to provide some background, generate support and ideas that will bring the use of the Hall back to pre-COVID times.

Malcolm took everyone through a slide show, available on the web site.

History of the Hall – How the Hall originated and developed over 300 plus years to where we are today.

New Structure – outlining the two different strands to the support structure, Trustees and Friends. The Trustee will oversee the Legal, Charity and Financial Stuff. The Friends group will enable those people who do not want the legal responsibility of Trusteeship to still be able to contribute and help with the organising and grafting needed to run events to achieve a fun and inclusive building environment.

Handover Process -

The Trustees to undertake the

- 1. Finalising and signing of the Hall lease with the Education Trust
- 2. Manage the finances of running the building, utilities, insurance, safety inspections etc.
- 3. Investigate the statues of current and potential grants.
- 4. To be part of the Friends team



The Friends to undertake the

- 1. Initiate and support events.
- 2. Promote the use of the Hall.
- 3. Utilise skills to maintain and clean the Hall.
- 4. Caretaking, cold weather support for heating and water. Security, key holders.

The aim is to make the Village Hall self- sustaining, as is the case with Winton and Brough, by keeping costs down and make use of volunteer labour, donations, and sponsorship from local businesses, etc.

Communicating – Malcolm ran through the different communication mediums, The web site KaberVH.com, the WhatsApp groups, Facebook Page, the Notice Boards and the hand delivered notices of events. These are to provide information on forthcoming events, Committee and Trustee News, Funding etc.
