Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report - Last year

- This is compiled from the documents and bank statements provided by the previous trustees.
- I have used these to create a set of accounts, showing
 - The starting balance was £35,578.07,
 - A total income was £1,367.73,
 - The total expenditure was £6,234.24,
 - Resulting in an operating loss of £4,866.51 for the year.
- These numbers have been accepted by the current Trustees and will be submitted to the Charity Commission.

Treasurer's Report - current year (to date)

- Firstly Accounts,
 - To make things simpler, we have created three accounts
 - A Savings Account, where we have moved as much cash as possible to get interest from the bank.
 - A Current Account, which we use for bills and larger expenditures.
 - A Petty Cash account, which we use for floats and small expenditures
 - (I opened this with £1.70 I found in a bag!)

Treasurer's Report - current year (to date)

- The Current Account shows an expenditure of £3,194.39
 - Does not include the £18,000 moved to the Saving Account
- The Savings Account income was only the interest noted above, giving a net balance of £26,187.56
 - This has generated an income of £237.87 so far this year
- The Petty Cash Account expenditure was only £92.56 with a further £315.00 being transferred to the Current Account.



Treasurer's Report - current year

- So, the net is we have *made* a total of £2,646.97
 - This is a reflection of everyone's support and generosity
 - Notice that this "profit" includes £3,400 in grant income.
 - That is a "one-time bonus",
 - But as Damon will mention later, there seems to be a constant supply of grants we are able to apply for.



Treasurer's Report - Detail Petty Cash

- There are two items which deserve recognition -
 - 1) there is an income of £32 recorded as "Charlotte Jewellery".
 - Most of you know that in August our friend and neighbour Charlotte Hinks passed away following a long illness, It was typical of her kind and positive nature that being unable to help with baking for a coffee morning she donated some of her jewellery to be sold as a donation to the village hall (suggesting a price of £1 per item). As you can see this raised £32 for hall funds.
 - 2) the other notable donation was £50 from Appleby Castle
 Grouse Moor in support of the Village Show.

Treasurer's Report - Detail Current Account

- Electricity costs are £1,127.27,
 - Which is why we want to make the hall more energy efficient!
- Hall maintenance costs of £985.98
 - Which reflects our efficiency investments in Loo and Kitchen heaters, new insulation and new lights.
- Hire of Hall and equipment have raised £1,064.00.
 - This figure excludes revenue generated by events.
- To see how important events are, I created a separate report.

Treasurer's Report - Detail Current Account

- We have held sixteen events so far this year. The profit from these events is £1,669.43
 - an excellent result and a compliment to your generosity.
- Total expenditure on the events has been only £256.81
 - This is an indication of the generosity of the Trustees, working group and many other helpers in providing catering and prizes free of charge.
- We cannot expect our events expenditure to be so low going forward.
